Thankyou sincerely for helping us meet the requirements that come with the restrictions, it is much appreciated.

Reporting to Parents, Semester 1

As I indicated in our last newsletter, there are some changes to our Reporting to Parents requirements due to the COVID-19 restrictions over terms one and two. There will be a Connect notice on our school space next week, and I would urge all parents to have a look at that for more detail.

In summary, with the regular attendance of many students being lower over this time, the breadth and depth of the curriculum covered throughout Semester 1 may have been reduced. For this reason, schools are not required to include A to E grades on this year's Semester 1 student reports. Sheoak Grove will provide learning area comments that will focus on student progress, student effort will be indicated across every learning area and the report general comment will remain as normal. This is an approach that is consistent with our

system requirements and schools across our network.

Our school will offer 1:1 meeting opportunities for parents to discuss student progress during a week to be arranged next term, or whenever we can meet the logistical needs that this would require within the COVID-19 Roadmap.

Parents can expect student reports to be delivered electronically early in week 10 of this term, giving you time to contact our staff with any questions you might have before the July school holidays. Please see the Connect notice next week for further detail.
