We have arrived at the end of our inaugural year! From February 3 2021 we will no longer be the New School in Baldivis. Pine View will take that title, and we wish Ms Heath and everyone involved at Pine View all the best for the exciting 12 months they have ahead of them.

We have had many highlights across our first year, too many to describe properly within the confines of this newsletter, but they have all been 'the first' and they've all been special. Importantly, we now have a springboard into the next phase of our school. We have an excellent foundation to build on, to develop our growth, our connection and the opportunities we give our students to shine.

2020 has been exceptionally challenging at times. On top of the specific tests that opening a school and establishing our programs and processes give rise to, we had 25% of our year severely disrupted due to the COVID pandemic. That forced us to modify the agenda for our inaugural year, to readjust and to re-evaluate what was achievable within the rest of the year.

It meant that, apart from the critical learning opportunities that occur in classrooms, things like swimming lessons, the Year 6 camp, incursions, carnivals and other really important events like Book Week and NAIDOC and had to either be heavily modified cancelled or postponed to another time. Of course that 'other time' was term 4, and we have had an extremely busy term as a result. The important thing is that we have done the things we focused on very successfully, and they have been very effective for our students.

COVID also gave us the opportunity to develop the connection we have with our parent community with some real urgency. We were only 6 weeks into our first term as a school when we had to confront the reality of online learning and all of the other components that

the situation brought with it. It gave our staff the opportunity to accelerate the way we developed our collaborative systems, to challenge and support each other and to build a wonderful staff culture that will launch the next phase of teaching and learning at Sheoak Grove, and welcome and support the people who are coming to join us in 2021.

Our parent community has been awesome through all of this too. When access to school wasn't possible, you understood, when things had to be postponed, you were patient, and when things had to be modified or even cancelled you were extremely accepting and supportive. Then, when we could get back to something approximating 'normal', you turned out in huge numbers to support everything we have done. That level of parental and community support has been simply amazing, and our entire staff has felt very much supported throughout the year. We value the connection we have with our community extremely highly, and sincerely appreciate the levels of support that we have received.

I am extremely proud of what we have achieved together as a school community in our inaugural year. I am proud of how we went about it and the connections we have made on the journey.

2021 will be another exciting year, full of opportunity and potential. We very much look forward to building on the sustainable foundations we have built together through the challenges that a rapidly growing school population brings.

On average, we have enrolled about one new family into our school each week across the year and our students have loved the opportunity to welcome new children into their school. Of course we say goodbye to our inaugural Year 6 students this week at their own assembly. There were only ever supposed to be 6 or 7 students in this cohort, but we quickly grew to 17 through the year. Even so, it is a small group, and one we are very proud of. They have been a wonderful group to have as our initial leaders and role models for younger students. They took every opportunity afforded to them and did a fantastic job on their Point Peron Camp and other end of school opportunities they have had including their art piece, the orienteering day and the challenge they undertook to name our factions. Congratulations to our Year 6 Student Leaders and Faction Captains for their work across 2020. They had many functions and assemblies to negotiate, including our official opening when they spoke in front of our Premier, our Minister for Education and our Director General along with a large crowd of dignitaries and community members.
